A meeting of the Goshen City Council was held on March 11, 2025 at 6:30pm at the Goshen Community Center.

City Council

Public Input - Ed Brandon, 35 year Goshen Resident and his house burned down about 15 months ago. Mr. Brandon wanted to share his thankfulness with the Goshen community as they have helped out a lot. Community members have come to him and his family to provide needed items. City Hall also provided for his family. It's taken 15 months but they are back home and re-built and he is thankful to all.

Max Poye asked about where he can find the Parks and Rec Committee Minutes because as of today, they are not on the website and there is no place for them on the website. Approved and signed should be posted on the website, per Mayor Stroud; however, the parks commission is not required to have minutes but we've done that because it helps us for Grants, which is why they are probably not on there. John Vaillancourt offered that the Parks and Rec minutes have been taken for the last 2 years. Mayor Stroud will speak with Lacie to add them to the website but if Mr. Poye would also like to email the City, they will be sent directly to him.

Approval of Minutes February 11, 2025 - Paula Anderson notated change needed regarding 'Shop Update'.

Verbiage should be changed from "Build Cost of \$16K" to "Architectural Design Cost"

Birch Wright motioned to approve as amended. John Vaillancourt seconded

All in favor; None opposed

Approval of Financial Report

As of 02/08/25 the General Fund has \$735,889.74 and the Street Fund has \$269,133.37 and Police 988 Fund has \$9,723.62. Our CD Balance is \$1,054,209.44. State Park/ARDOT funds combined \$3,074.20. Farmers Market fund \$1,783.16.

Paula Anderson made a motion to approve and it was seconded by John Vaillancourt.

Public Comment: None

All in favor; none opposed.

Notation from Paula Anderson that it looks like the CDs will come up for maturity in April and to make sure we are aware of that target date of 4/15/25 for renewal and get a meeting together. Kaseana will schedule the meeting.

Mayor Stroud added - There is a State level bill (that we are waiting to see if it passes/waiting on 3rd reading) that would potentially change the way we receive turn-back funds from the County. It would have to go to a public vote at the County level for it to change our income that we receive but if it were to go to the County and we get that funding pulled from us, it will decrease our funding by almost \$500K per year and potentially more (from \$1.5M to \$1M). Small cities would be hugely impacted. Birch Wright asked if the approval process has to go through the quorum court. Mayor says, yes, at the County level it will go through quorum court to change the way they would either keep or deliver our funds back to us at the County level from a County Sales Tax. Birch Wright and Mayor agree that we need to be proactive with the courts. It was stated by some of the state senators in Benton County and he's not sure why it was drafted and why it was put forward; waiting on the third reading.

Police Report (7A) - Chief Travis

146 calls for service. 14 charges, 1 City Ordinance violation, 1 criminal, 1 PCS, 1 PDP charge, 3 warrants 11 Moving citations, 55 Warning citations.

There was also a unit wreck that was totaled out. No one was hurt and insurance will pay us back \$20,900 (w/deductible already removed). The new unit is at Superior Automotive getting fitted and it will be ready for striping. Mayor has been provided with a proof, which is deceiving as it makes the unit look blue; it's actually gray and it should be more than visible. The black lettering has a silver lining around it. Chief Travis would like to get that approved. Birch Wright asked about details of the accident; information provided as Officer (Nathan) was traveling westbound on 45 and a truck that was coming eastbound had a Tesla pass it (in a no passing zone); the guy that hit him was in a 1-ton truck w/a load of mulch on the truck and a trailer full of mulch so there was a lot of weight that hit him. Confirmed everyone is ok. Mayor Stroud added we should go ahead and get unit replaced with the exact same design and color as the other one that we've already ordered. John Vaillancourt asked about the one that came in @\$60K. Chief Travis indicates it is fully outfitted and camera and radios are the only thing still needing to be installed; this unit, even before radio and camera, it can be put into service; officer will use portable for radio and body-cam so that we are not short on units. It's coming in to replace the eldest truck (2018). The unit that was totaled was the next unit inline to be replaced. John Vaillancourt asked about Jessie's unit with the engine - confirmed with Chief Travis that it (the engine) has not been replaced as of yet. Chief Travis says we are waiting on the mechanic who indicates he can get to it in April. At that point (replacement for Nathan's, new one, and the engine replacement unit), we'll have 3 new units and they will be matching, with the exception of Jessie's being the black instead of the battleship gray. Birch Wright asked about taking the governor off of the new units and asked where we are on that; Chief Travis advised that it was approved to change out the PCMs. He also added that with the new units we shouldn't have to do that again; the actual pursuit units should hit about 135mph and we should have what we need.

Birch Wright also added that a discussion last month that residents are concerned about jake-brakes and enforcing that issue. Chief Travis confirmed police will be citing violators. Chief Travis inquired about getting more signs to put up in regard to jake-brakes and Mayor Stroud indicated that the City will have to get with ARDOT to get the signs ordered (no jake-brakes). Confirmed there are already signs near Mayfield and one at Slaughter Mountain. Chief Travis wants another one closer to the city limits on Highway 45.

John Vaillancourt requested, moving forward, the Council would like to be notified of issues like the accident that happened. Mayor Stroud confirmed that definitely that will happen (notification to Council) and that he was unaware that Keseana had not sent out an email. Paula Anderson and John Vaillancourt said they never received any communication, other than when they received the packet/agenda.

Street Department Report

At City Park they trimmed trees at the entrance of the park along with Mike Nimmo (Parks Commission); added dirt in the area where stone is to be placed. Mayor met with engraver at Gibson Monument and they are working on the engraving to get it done as soon as he can. Delayed due to weather.

Roads - Cleared snow, salted street, spread gravel, created parking lot spaces at the community building (more railroad ties and gravel).

Maintenance - Volunteers collected trash on Hale and Firetower Road(s) and washed city vehicles for school credit. This is a community service program through the highschool(s) and there is a portal that Lacie (office) has been working with. They sign up online, we don't know who they're going to be until day of (it sends us their name) and the City directs them as to what they'll do on that day as far as Community Service.

Future Projects

Seal the wall at the south park entrance and paint metal support poles (posts with the chain; add boulders and/or trees later), continue installing street signs which have to be hand dug (due to utilities), install welcome stone at the north park entrance. Mayor went and picked out two big stones (at a cost of \$1500) - one for the South entrance and one for the Community Building. Patch pot holes on City streets, seal and clean the concrete on Oxford Bend Bridge and Blue Springs Road. When the bridges get salt or open areas, they start to rust and it can downgrade inspections. City is making sure they are maintained well. Photos provided of work that has been done.

Goshen Fire District Report

February, 2025 - 40 incidents total and the total types, 32 Rescue and Emergency Services (28 of those were medical assist/assist EMS crew), 2 hazardous condition, 2 Service calls, 2 Good Intent calls, 1 false alarm.

Mayor Stroud added that the fire station is being painted and they've met with the painters and the painting will start on 3/12/25. They will also seal where the birds have been getting in. He also talked with Chief Carter and they are going to try and get a new sign for Station 1 that matches Station 2.

Planning Commission Report

Vet Clinic design was approved with the exception of lighting and the fencing because it doesn't meet the current ordinance. The lighting will be redone because of the lumens but they also had a light engineer come in and all will be dark-sky compliant other than the lumens that we have right now on our ordinance. In regards to the fencing at the vet clinic, Mayor Stroud met with some of the neighbors (Bordeaux Village) and none of them

want a wooden fence (ordinance requirement); they would rather have vegetations but that violates our ordinance at this time so it is being worked on to get that fixed (via Planning) but we do have conditional approval, subject to those two items to come back before the final.

John Vaillancourt indicates he did not receive the Planning Commission agenda via email (which is normal protocol); Paul Anderson confirmed she did not. Recorder/Treasurer will do better to ensure delivery to all. Planning Commission took in \$400 in fees in the first quarter for lot adjustment(s).

Building Inspection Report - JD (inspector) did quite a few inspections (14) - most in Ashers Ranch. Birch Wright thanked JD for reaching out when he saw a fire issue in Waterford. Birch elaborated that a subdivision/neighbor was burning his treated lumber from his old deck in 30mph winds.

Parks and Recreation Report - Danielle Edwards - Danielle went to Little Rock on 3/6/25 and accepted a check from Governor Sanders; Met on the 25th and discussed outreach projects for groups and clubs that will help with grants in the future. Continuing to take out the bob-wired fencing and trim dead trees. Linda Moore's term was up at the end of December and we need to get her re-appointed. Linda indicates she would like to be re-appointed. Mayor Stroud said this will be brought to the next meeting and we will get that resolution taken care of.

Mayor Stroud that the city met with Ozarks Electric and we will be able to get electricity into the park that's why we are going to bring that resolution. Because the gas line is so deep, we can go over the top of it and it'll be a buried line and it will put us in compliance with the State Park Regulations that we don't have overhead lines at the park. DesignScapes will be moving forward w/in the next week or two for their project at the Park.

Old City Business

Review of Parks Master Plan - Paula Anderson indicates a lot of numbering is off as far as the page numbers corresponding with to the title and content; also for clarification there is a table of contents with numbers along the different items and we also have page numbers - perhaps consider roman numerals or letters and have that listed with headers in the document so that it is clearer; there is also two places that have Public Involvement headers in a row, that are 2 pages apart. Mayor Stroud indicated that the way it was written (originally) was for a SCORP and it has to be listed in certain sections so that was to make it compliant with the SCORP but we can make the Table of Content match better and more organized. Paula further added wording items (making sure the Headers match what's in the document) and make sure we are using consistent terminology. Paula added about the 40 bikes (Highland Valley Tournament) were given away to "kids in need" but she thought those 40 bikes went to kids all around Northwest Arkansas, not just kids in our community. Mayor Stroud responded there were 13-15 bikes that went to kids in Goshen and once they were handed out (to kids in attendance), then the other bikes were given to other citizens. There were additional bikes given to Goshen citizens and they had to come to City Hall to pick them up. Paula was seeking clarification on that documentation (in the verbiage). Some formatting issues that need to be cleaned up (Abby is working on it).

Birch Wright added that the content is good but is seeking clarification that in 50 years when the current committee and Mayor are not in these positions any longer, we/City want/need to be able to refer back to the Master Plan as a Source of Truth so we need to have an ordinance that shows that is the Source of Truth, yes? (Is that what we are trying to do on letter C - Ordinance Ensuring Master Plan Adherence?) - Adhere to the plan rather than the wishes of the Parks Committee. Mayor Stroud responded that the Master Plan is where we want to see the City's Parks go; he sees the intent of C (adherence) if someone violates the Master Plan then, legally, Chief Travis can hold them responsible. We already have park rules that hold people accountable and if there's

any illegal action, Chief Travis will arrest them anyway (trespassing, not adhering to park rules already established). Mayor says we need a master plan (codified for people to look at) and know that is the direction the park is going. Shawn Mayfield added if there's changes, Council would have to approve it. Mayor suggests (with the amount of work involved) that we do it every couple of years, as projects are completed. Things do change but the intent is that it stays in the same focus of all the projects that come forward along with input from the survey(s) that have been sent out. Mayor wants to send an annual survey for community feedback regarding the park because the input can change from year to year as to the wants and needs of the community. He believes it will change and grow as time goes on and absolutely thinks we need to have the Ordinance for the Master Plan; he remains unsure about the Adherence because if something changes between the time it is created and updated, it needs to allow for something to be changed in the park, then our hands will be tied; if there's a grant that comes up that says we can run water throughout the park and it's not listed in our master plan (and we have to dig ditches to do it) then we will be violating our own master plan; we'd have to go back and change the Master Plan before we can even Adhere to it.

Birch Wright provided an example for reference: If someone wants to put in a 500' cell tower in the park? Mayor advises we can't do that anyway because we've accepted Federal and State funds so we can't put anything there like that. We can't sell the park; we can't go in and put any kind of structure we want in the park, as it is. Birch says the concern is, if someone came forward and said they want to X-Y-Z and the Parks Commission says, ok, there is nothing ordinance wise that would prohibit that. He (Birch) reads this as, if you do something wrong, we will slap your hand - not tell you, no you can't do it. John Vaillancourt agrees that we should have Adherence in place. Mayor feels with Adherence and something comes up that needs to be done, it's going to take us going back through the Council to approve a new Master Plan and us updating it before we can actually do it. Without that, we are violating our own law and we've been doing enough of that in the City where we violate our own ordinances because our ordinances don't match what we are doing in the City. Feels strongly that we need a Master Plan to follow the laws in place. Birch agrees and John Vaillancourt agrees that we need a Master Plan but we also need Adherence to the Master Plan.

Paul Anderson asked for middle-ground where we can say "addendums can be made to the Master Plan upon consideration and passage by the City Council" so as to not have to re-write the whole plan but utilize an Addendum(s). Mayor responded that every 2 years we are going to update the plan, then we have to go back and have another ordinance to adhere to the new plan. If we have a Parks Master Plan that's the plan for us to follow as the City for the Park. Council sets the law as to what can happen in the Park; if you say, this is the master plan and we are not going to vary from the master plan, nothing is going to be able to be approved without coming to Council first. We have to comply with all of the environmental protection stuff put in that HUD grant just like with electricity, City has to follow all the State guidelines on the requirements we have to comply with in order to maintain that State Park Grant money that we took; certain requirements that we don't have control over either.

Public Comment: Max Poye doesn't feel every time you change the plan that you need a new ordinance to adhere to it. What would prevent the Council deciding they liked Bradford Pear Trees (invasive species) and there was a whole bunch planted - it won't be on the master plan but it can happen so if you have an ordinance that says you should adhere to whatever is approved in the master plan, he agrees with Paula, that you wouldn't have to update the master plan, and maybe there needs to be some way that, yes, we can apply for this Grant (w/an Addendum). With the climate of the country, in general, he feels like it is important to have something that 'officials will stick to the approved plan'. He thinks it's important to have some way to address the Council or Mayor 10 years down the line. Mayor Stroud responded that he sees it as another level of bureaucracy that

will create more difficulty later on and asked for Parks Committee members that are in attendance at this meeting to chime in with their thoughts. Linda Moore needs more clarification if you're (Council) asking does the master plan that's created and accepted now is one that can never be changed? If not, your concern with an all new Council and Mayor, I am not understanding your fear???? John Vaillancourt responded, that can be part of it - yes. Chief Travis added that, as a new Council, they can come in and undo everything this Council has already done so what's the point in making an ordinance that a new City Council can come in and change anyway? Mayor Stroud added that a lot of ordinances that are cumbersome and contradict each other (subdivision, commercial design standards, lighting, driveways) and he's trying to get away from having ordinances on the books that don't make any sense. Example: The new vet clinic - everyone agrees (including neighbors) that they don't want a wooden fence and yet but we can't say, as a City, even if they bring it to Council, we have no variance process - we can't change it - so we have to create entire new ordinances and the time that it takes to create these ordinances (and make them fit) - having the variance process is a much better use of time and allow them to be in compliance with each other where we are not violating one ordinance of the other; feels this is another level of bureaucracy that will make it harder in the future for us to be able to get work done. Doesn't feel there is anyone that will come in and just start doing what they want in the park without coming to the Council first; just because an elected official comes in and does something doesn't mean they are immune from violating state law and State and Federal law is what is protecting the Park right now (with the money that we've received from HUD and State Park Grants that we've received).

Cheryl Nimmo asked - doesn't the EPA Grant specify no invasives? Mayor Stroud confirmed, yes. Abby (office) added that conservation easement was explored with NWA Local Land Trust and they said with how undeveloped the park is currently that easement is not necessary now but can be added later (10-15 years). The conservation easement helps as an additional protection for the park.

Linda Moore asked about a past land usage discussion (in certain places - you can't put a house/subdivision or you can't put commercial) and what was this called/named; isn't there something in place?. Max Poye responded that was before we got the big money grant and doesn't recall the name. Mayor Stroud confirmed that we can't do any of that at this time because of the grant money that we've received (majority of the park land was purchase through grant money) and all of those restrict future use that's in perpetuity that has to remain park land and there's a lot of restrictions that go with it.

John Vaillancourt asked about cleaning up the master plan first (finished form) before we can even move on the other two items (Establishing Master Plan Process and Adherence). Mayor Stroud confirmed and further asked that any edits or comments if the Council can get those over to Abby (office). Birch Wright asked if there's any value to adding a variance comment in the proposed ordinance (Ensurance of Adherence); Mayor Stroud stressed again that he feels that it is a redundant ordinance. We have park rules, we have a master plan, we have State and Federal law that we have to comply and now you want to add the City Ordinance on top of it? Birch responded that he is talking about adding another line w/in the proposed ordinance saying that Council can tell you 'no' or fine you (essentially, any variances outside of the plan have to have City Council approval). Colton Martin supported adding the additional verbiage as Birch suggested and Mayor Stroud agreed that he is ok with it. Colton further added (and speaking for other members of Council) that they don't want people, in the future, to go and make changes to the park without it going through the Council first. Mayor Stroud reiterated that he doesn't see how that could happen (City Hall is not going to violate anything that is in the Master Plan). Birch Wright added that his concern is that the plan is the plan and he understands that there is a process attached to any changes to that plan and that the plan is good but there's got to be 'teeth' behind it (the only 'teeth' is that we will fine you). He believes there needs to be an 'out' by adding a line such as 'variances can be considered by City Council as needed' (not another step, just teeth behind the ordinance); just adding this line

covers both sides. John Vaillancourt added as long as it covers and does what the additional ordinance would do. Mayor Stroud sees it as a better way to do it as he doesn't want added ordinances. Mayor further added the example of Crossland Construction (needed to fix a water line) and that the only place for them to park their equipment was on park land (south entrance). He authorized it but didn't come through City Council because there was no time to go through City Council (via monthly meeting times to seek approval). If Mayor had had to follow the Adherence to the Master Plan there would've been a special session needed to be able to authorize them to be able to utilize that park space to fix that water line. Birch Wright added this was a good example and that Mayor did have that authority to make that decision - Mayor stressed that if he would not have the same authority if this (adherence) goes into ordinance because it would violate our master plan. John Vaillancourt disagrees because you're not doing something to the park to change it moving forward. Birch Wright believes that Council has already given authority to Mayor to do that and that is part of the build process. Mayor Stroud does agree with putting a variance process into the master plan - the master plan would be adhered to unless the Council authorizes a variance to the master plan - further confirming that it is part of the ordinance for the master plan (get rid of Ordinance Ensuring Master Plan Adherence and include that into Ordinance Establishing Master Plan Process and incorporate the Adherence to with a variance process) - Birch NAL agrees and that is his recommendation. Brian Hogue to redo. Mayor asked for a motion to table and bring back next month; Birch Wright made the motion and Colton Martin seconded.

City Project Updates

Behind the Community building there's a rock retaining wall w/drainage pipe that directs water around the building; it will be a solid wall w/drainage ditch and they cut the concrete so that it drains all the water. Two large rocks have been purchased (same as in front of Ponchos) - one to identify the Community Building and one at the South Entrance of the Park. Both entrances have water; met with Ozarks Electric and waiting on final bid for buried electric (bid is \$14K-\$15K) from pole at Ron Russell's, around behind the parking and across ravine to the main part of the park where the pavilion is going.

Pavilion fund money received and now contracting with an engineering firm to get that out to bid; Mayor will be meeting with them over the next couple of weeks to get that underway and organized. Will probably bring that next month to Council for review before we send out for bid.

Paula Anderson asked if we received a copy of the submitted Grant application (what is actually in the Grant application for the State park) to compare and get another set of eyes on it. Mayor will have Abby send to everyone.

Mayor will meet with Olsson to determine an exit date to anticipate more landscaping to not end up with dirt (want to seed and get it growing).

Roads - we are getting a bid together for culverts and will be brought to City Council next month because approximately 12-14 culverts need replacing in the City. Anticipates a large chunk of street fund to get those done.

Shop Building - 2 different people have looked at it w/design plans and they are uncertain of the costs due to metal construction costs are going up but they will try to get us an estimate of costs. Also waiting on CAD drawings back from OzarkAg. The shop building costs will be from Capital Fund.

New City Business

Police Department Car(s) - Vehicle gun metal gray (flat matte gray) and lettering is silver-lined around the black to stand out a little better. Chief Travis confirmed it's the same lettering we have on our units now but will pop more on that black/gray color.

Resolution for Grant Application - Grant is due on Thursday (3/13/25)- didn't find out about it until 3/10/25 - a needed item to be able to apply for this grant is a resolution for us to be able to apply for the Electrifying of the South Entrance of the Park. It authorizes us to be able to match a \$15K grant. Birch Wright says if it's within your (Mayor) authority, go ahead and do it. Mayor says we don't technically have to have a resolution but it's always better to have it for the application of the Grant.

Birch Wright made a motion to read and title only and John Vaillancourt seconded

Abby (office) read aloud:

Resolution #2025-12 - A resolution expressing the willingness of the City of Goshen, Arkansas, to apply for the Arkansas Rural Community Grant

Motion to adopt made by Colton Martin and seconded by John Vaillancourt

Public Comment: None

All in favor; none opposed

Old Police Vehicle (totaled) - need authorization of capital funds to be able to pay for the remaining portion not covered by insurance. City put \$70K in the budget for a new police vehicle and we're at \$60K on the purchase of it. We will also receive \$20K from insurance company - we are asking to take \$30K out of Capital to buy a new vehicle. Mayor further states this would be an unforeseen capital expenditure (not currently in budget). Birch Wright asked about the Capital budget being at \$184K. Jerry (financial) confirmed capital budget at approximately \$184K and that it will come up as a capital expenditure. The \$70K is in the 2025 budget; the engine was covered for \$20K; with conversations from December, they were going to take those 2 things from the general budget and not go below \$600K threshold that we like to maintain; right now we have \$735K with new money coming in but we can come into additional money by utilizing the interest on the CDs (that are coming up for renewal on the 15th of April). Jerry suggests pulling some of the interest (to fund larger unexpected costs) without jeopardizing the CDs (about \$30K); then go back to the original amount for CDs before they start renewing (because they've just been rolling over), see what the cumulative interest has been from the beginning, and pull that interest off. Birch Wright agrees. Mayor added at the recommendation of the Council, when he met with the contractors for the shop building (larger expenditure), they are giving an estimate with and without a bathroom just to give us the difference in cost. Birch Wright agrees and totally supports the police replacement vehicle but to keep an eye on the Capital budget.

Birch Wright made a motion to approve the use of Capital funds for the expenditure of the replacement of the police vehicle that was totaled including looking at the interest from the CDs to supplement that cost and John Vaillancourt seconded.

Public Comment: None

Motion to police vehicle striping as presented was made by Birch Wright and seconded by Paula Anderson

Asset List Removal Request for Computers - 2 computers that are not functioning well (purchased in 2016 and 2018) and City would like to remove them from Capital Asset List and have those destroyed/recycle (thru network services agreement) and it will also remove them from the licensures that they are carrying and they can be moved onto the ones we (City) has now (depreciation already taken).

Birch Wright made a motion to remove and John Vaillancourt seconded

Public Comment: None

Additional Comments: Colton Martin asked if packets can be sent out sooner than (most recent distribution) Monday's. Paula Anderson added that even if you can send in pieces, but just sooner, then what they are currently receiving. Mayor will address in office.

Birch Wright thanked Keseana for her work with a recent issue being taken care of swiftly.

Jerry (Financial) is engaging in conversations with firms about performing fair market values for City assets; just wanted to let City Council know.

Birch Wright addressed a potential stipend for Jerry (Financial) as he is currently working for free. Mayor added that they are bringing a proposal to Council that he (Mayor) is looking to bring Jerry on as a potential Chief of Staff to assist him (given time constraints, knowledge, etc.); a stipend would be supported by Mayor as well.

Mike Nimmo - City clean up day - Mike wanted to thank Ferris Insurance (?) for a donation of high-visibility vests, and trash bags, and trash pick up utensils - it helped quite a bit.

Mayor Stroud would like to do a mind-map for next meeting with priorities from the City Council notated.
